

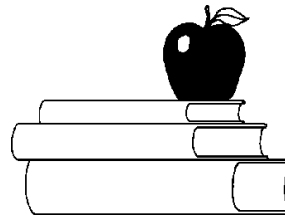
# JOB SEARCH FACTS FOR TEACHERS:

Local school districts conducted 570 interviews with Buffalo State candidates at Teacher Recruitment Days in 2016.

A recent survey of 312 school districts, representing 28 states, reported that 70% use social media tools like Facebook and LinkedIn to screen or “vet” teaching applicants.

On average, a school district spends 10 seconds looking at your resume to decide whether you will be called in for an interview.

98% of participants in Teacher Recruitment Days had a better understanding of what school districts expect from them.
